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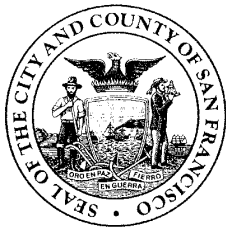

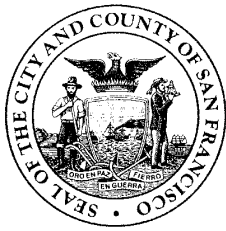

Following such a withdrawal, additional members of the Board of Supervisors may join in support of the proposed measure provided that they do so in writing before the legal deadline for submission of the measure to the Department of Elections.</p> <p>No Supervisor may withdraw his or her support for a measure after July 28, 2015, unless it is a <b>unanimous</b> withdrawal proposed by four or more Supervisors who supported the measure. 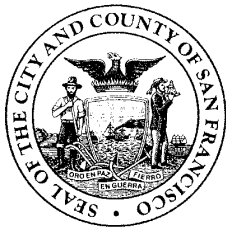

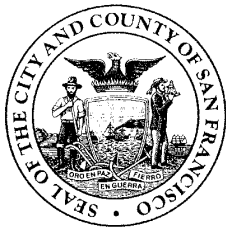

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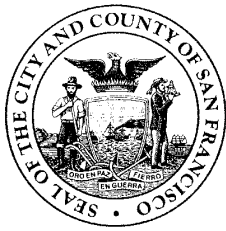
