The Department of Public Works currently has four divisions: Building Design and Construction, which designs, builds and renovates many City buildings and structures; Infrastructure Design and Construction, which maintains the City's streets, sidewalks, curb ramps and street structures, such as plazas, bridges, tunnels and stairways; Finance and Administration; and Operations, which performs City building repair, street and sewer repair, maintenance of street trees, cleaning of public streets and sidewalks, graffiti removal, and removal and replacement of sidewalk trash cans. The City Administrator oversees the Department of Public Works, and appoints its Director. The Mayor must concur with the City Administrator's appointment of the Director of Public Works. The Proposal: Proposition would create a five-member Public Works Commission to oversee the Department of Public Works, instead of the City Administrator. The Board of Supervisors would appoint two members to the commission, the Mayor would appoint two members, and the City's Controller would appoint one member. Under Proposition , the Mayor would appoint the Director of Public Works, chosen from applicants selected by the Public Works Commission. Proposition \_\_\_ would also create a new Department of Sanitation and Streets separate from the Department of Public Works. This new department would take over some duties that the Department of Public Works currently handles, including: street sweeping and sidewalk cleaning; maintaining and cleaning public restrooms; providing and maintaining sidewalk trash cans; removing illegally dumped waste and graffiti; and maintaining street trees. Proposition \_\_\_\_\_ would authorize the Board of Supervisors to change this new department's duties in the future by ordinance.

and the City's Controller would appoint one member.

Under Proposition \_\_\_\_\_, a five-member Sanitation and Streets Commission would oversee the Department of Sanitation and Streets. The Board of Supervisors would appoint two members to the commission, the Mayor would appoint two members,

Under Proposition \_\_\_\_, the Mayor would appoint the Director of Sanitation and Streets Commission, chosen from applicants selected by the Sanitation and Streets Commission.

**A "YES" Vote Means:** If you vote "yes," you want to establish a Public Works Commission to oversee the Department of Public Works, and to create a new Department of Sanitation and Streets with oversight by a Sanitation and Streets Commission.

A "NO" Vote Means: If you vote "no," you do not want to make this change.
