REG BSC 3-1-22 Behested Payments Reconsideration Request DP 220302

I hereby request reconsideration of the Approved Digest for the ballot measure with the working title "Behested Payments". I have included the text adopted by the Committee with my alternate language as tracked changes. I recommend these changes to increase accuracy and clarity. Thanks. DP

**The Way It Is Now:** A behested payment is a donation <u>requested solicited</u> by a public official to benefit either a government agency or a private organization.

City law generally prohibits elected officials, <u>members of board and commissions</u>-commissioners, department heads and other City employees with decision-making authority from <u>requesting</u> seeking these payments from any of the following:

• businesses and individuals contracting with or seeking to contract with their department departments;

- individuals persons who attempted to influence them regarding with respect to governmental actions;
- lobbyists registered to lobby their <u>department</u>-departments;
- permit expediters who have contacted their <u>department departments</u> during the previous 12 months; or
- <u>individuals persons</u> involved in <u>proceedings with</u> their <u>department departments' proceedings</u> regarding administrative enforcement, a license or a permit.

The Board of Supervisors (Board) can <u>change amend</u> this law by a majority vote.

**The Proposal:** Proposition \_ <u>is an ordinance that</u> would <u>change City</u> <u>amend the City's existing</u> law regarding behested payments <u>in with</u> two<u>ways</u> <u>additions</u>:

• members of the Board could not seek behested payments from <u>businesses and individuals contracting</u> with the <u>City contractors</u> if the Board had approved <u>the contract</u> their contracts; and

• the Board could <u>change City later amend the City's</u> law regarding behested payments only if the City's Ethics Commission approves the <u>change proposed amendments</u> by a majority vote and the Board then approves <u>the change them</u> by a two-thirds vote <u>of its members</u>.

A "YES" Vote Means: If you vote "yes," you want to <u>change City amend the City's</u> law regarding behested payments.

A "NO" Vote Means: If you vote "no," you do not want to make these changes.
