REG BSC 8-2-22 GGP Access and Safety Program Reconsideration Req DP 220803

I hereby request reconsideration of the Approved Digest for this ballot measure. I have included the text adopted by the Committee with my alternate language as tracked changes. I recommend these changes to increase accuracy and clarity. Thanks. DP

The Way It Is Now: The City's In April 2022, the Board of Supervisors (Board) and the Mayor approved adopted the Golden Gate Park Access and Safety Program (the Ordinance) in May 2022, which that closed portions of John F. Kennedy Drive (JFK Drive) and certain other connector streets in Golden Gate Park seven days a week to private motor vehicles, keeping reserving the streets as open space for recreational uses. These street closures do not apply to emergency vehicles, official government vehicles, park intra-park transit-shuttle buses and similar vehicles authorized to transport people, and vehicles making deliveries to the de Young Museum.

The Proposal: Proposition <u>is an ordinance that</u> would <u>approve affirm by voter approval</u> the Ordinance <u>that</u> the Board <u>and the Mayor approved adopted in May April-2022, which closed portions of JFK Drive and certain other streets in Golden Gate Park, keeping the streets as open space for <u>recreational uses</u>.</u>

If Proposition _ would allow passes, the Board and the Mayor to change may later amend the Ordinance by a majority vote.

If Proposition _ passes with more votes than Proposition [initiative], then <u>provisions of Proposition _ would take effect instead of Proposition [initiative] would have no legal effect.</u>

A "YES" Vote Means: If you vote "yes," you want to approve affirm the Ordinance that the Board and the Mayor approved adopted in May April 2022, which closed reserving portions of JFK Drive and certain other connector streets in Golden Gate Park, keeping the streets as open space for recreational uses, and allow the Board and the Mayor to change the Ordinance by a majority vote recreation spaces, closing those streets seven days a week to private motor vehicle traffic with limited exceptions.

A "NO" Vote Means: If you vote "no," you do not want to <u>make these changes-affirm the Board's April 2022 Ordinance.</u>
