## REG BSC 8-1-22 Homelessness Oversight Commission Recon Request DP 220802

I hereby request reconsideration of the Approved Digest for this ballot measure. I have included the text adopted by the Committee with my alternate language as tracked changes. I recommend these changes to increase accuracy and clarity. Thanks. DP

The Way It Is Now: The In 2016, the City established a Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing (Department) in 2016. The Department directs and manages and directs housing, programs and services for homeless people persons experiencing homelessness, including street outreach, homeless shelters, transitional housing and permanent supportive housing.

The mayor appoints and may remove the director of the Department. The City Charter does not <u>include</u> services related to <u>require audits of homelessness</u> as a service area for data collection and comparison services, and a City commission does not oversee the Department.

The City's Local Homeless Coordinating Board and other advisory bodies make recommendations on homeless policy and budget allocations. The Mmayor, the Board of Supervisors (Board) and the City Ceontroller appoint members to these the advisory bodies.

**The Proposal:** Proposition \_ <u>is a Charter amendment that</u> would create a Homelessness Oversight Commission (Commission) to oversee the Department.

The Commission would have seven members who would serve <u>staggered</u> four-year terms. The <u>M</u>mayor would appoint four members, and the Board of Supervisors would appoint three. The <u>M</u>mayor's appointees would be subject to Board approval.

The mayor's four appointees would must have the following qualifications:

- one seat would be for a person who has <u>personally</u> experienced homelessness;
- one seat would be for a person with significant experience providing services to or engaging in advocacy on behalf of persons experiencing homelessness;
- one seat would be for a person with expertise in providing mental health services or substance <u>use</u> abuse treatment; and
- one seat would be for a person who has participated in a <u>merchants, merchants' or small\_business</u> association, or a neighborhood association.

In addition to these qualifications, at least one of the <u>M</u>mayor's appointees <u>would must</u> also have experience in <u>auditing</u>, budgeting <u>and</u>, finance <u>and auditing</u>.

The Board's appointees would must have the following qualifications:

- one seat would be for a person who has personally experienced homelessness;
- one seat would be for a person with significant experience working with homeless families with children or homeless youth; and

- one seat would be <u>for</u> a person with significant experience providing services to or engaging in advocacy on behalf of persons experiencing homelessness; and-
- one seat would be for a person with significant experience working with homeless families with children or homeless youth.

Proposition \_ would require the City Ceontroller to <u>include services related to eonduct audits of</u> homelessness as a service area for data collection and comparison—services.

**A "YES" Vote Means:** If you vote "yes," you want to establish a Homelessness Oversight Commission to oversee the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing and require the City Ceontroller to include services related to conduct audits of homelessness as a service area for data collection and comparison services.

A "NO" Vote Means: If you vote "no," you do not want to make these changes.
