I hereby request reconsideration of the Approved Digest for this ballot measure. I have included the text adopted by the Committee with my alternate language as tracked changes. I recommend these changes to increase accuracy and clarity. Thanks. DP

The Way It Is Now: The <u>City's</u> Department of Public Works (DPW) is generally responsible for designing, constructing and improving the City's infrastructure, including buildings, streets, sidewalks, bridges and public stairways.

<u>The In November 2020</u>, the voters approved a Charter amendment in November 2020 authorizing creation of a new Department of Sanitation and Streets. This department does not yet exist.

The Charter amendment also <u>created</u> <u>required the City to create</u> two new commissions: <u>a Public Works</u> <u>Commission to oversee DPW</u>, <u>and</u> a Sanitation and Streets Commission to oversee the Department of Sanitation and Streets <u>and a Public Works Commission to oversee the DPW</u>.

The Proposal: Proposition _ <u>is a Charter amendment that</u> would eliminate the Department of Sanitation and Streets and transfer its duties back to <u>DPW</u>-the Department of Public Works.

Proposition _ would retain <u>both the Public Works Commission and</u> the Sanitation and Streets Commission. The Sanitation and Streets Commission would hold public hearings and set policies on these issues for DPW regarding sanitation standards and protocols, and maintenance of the public right of way the Department of Public Works.

A "YES" Vote Means: If you vote "yes," you want to eliminate the Department of Sanitation and Streets and transfer its duties back to the Department of Public Works. You also want to retain both commissions.

A "NO" Vote Means: If you vote "no," you do not want to make these changes.
