REG BSC 8-2-22 Uses of the Great Highway and JFK Drive Recon Request DP 220803

I hereby request reconsideration of the Approved Digest for this ballot measure. I have included the text adopted by the Committee with my alternate language as tracked changes. I recommend these changes to increase accuracy and clarity. Thanks. DP

The Way It Is Now: The City has closed certain public streets to private motor vehicles, <u>in response to</u> <u>the COVID-19 pandemic</u>, <u>and kept those reserving the</u>-streets as open space for recreational purposes. These closures were enacted in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

<u>The In April 2022, the Board of Supervisors (Board) and the Mayor approved adopted the Golden Gate</u> Park Access and Safety Program in May 2022 (Ordinance), which that closed portions of John F. Kennedy Drive (JFK Drive) and certain <u>other connector</u> streets in Golden Gate Park seven days a week to private motor vehicles. These <u>street</u> closures do not apply to emergency vehicles, official government vehicles, <u>park intra-park transit</u> shuttle buses and similar vehicles <u>authorized to transport people</u>, and vehicles making deliveries to the de Young Museum.

The Great Highway is closed to motor vehicles, with limited exceptions, from noon Fridays to 6 a.m. Mondays and on holidays. The City <u>is planning intends</u> to remove the Great Highway between Sloat Boulevard and Skyline Boulevard to protect City [facilities or infrastructure] from damage caused by sea level rise, <u>and traffic</u>. The City would <u>be redirected redirect vehicle traffic</u> along Skyline, Sunset and Sloat <u>Bb</u>oulevards.

The Proposal: Proposition _ <u>is an ordinance that</u> would restrict the City's ability to limit private vehicle use of JFK Drive and certain <u>other connector</u> streets in Golden Gate Park and the Great Highway.

Proposition _ would repeal the <u>May Board's April 2022 O</u>ordinance and require the City to allow private motor vehicles to use JFK Drive and certain <u>other connector</u> streets in Golden Gate Park at all times except from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Sundays and legal holidays, as well as on Saturdays <u>from in April to</u> through September.

Proposition _ would require the City to allow motor vehicle use in both directions at all times on the Great Highway and would not allow the City to remove the Great Highway between Sloat and Skyline Bboulevards as planned.

<u>Under Proposition _, for For</u> both the Great Highway and JFK Drive, along with the other affected streets in Golden Gate Park, the City could temporarily limit access to these <u>streets in response roads to</u> respond to emergencies, for street repairs and for community events.

If Proposition _ would allow passes, the Board and the Mayor to change its provisions may later amend this ordinance by a two-thirds vote, only if the <u>changes amendments</u> are either consistent with the <u>measure's purposes of Proposition</u> or required by a court.

If Proposition _ passes with more votes than Proposition [four-supes measure], then <u>provisions of</u> <u>Proposition _ would take effect instead of</u> Proposition [four-supes measure] would have no legal effect.

A "YES" Vote Means: If you vote "yes," you want to require the City to allow private motor vehicle use vehicles on JFK Drive and certain other connector streets in Golden Gate Park at all times except from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Sundays and legal holidays, as well as on Saturdays from in April to through

September. You also want to require the City to allow motor vehicle use in both directions at all times on the Great Highway and not allow the City to remove the Great Highway between Sloat and Skyline <u>B</u>boulevards as planned.

A "NO" Vote Means: If you vote "no," you do not want to make these changes.
