Any protests to this notice must be submitted in compliance with the general requirements of Regulation 21.3(i) (Bid Protests) of the San Francisco Administrative Code and Section 6.3 of the RFP. The deadline for submission of protests is 5:00 p.m., July 10, 2020.

At this time, the Department intends to award \$35,054 to your organization and will contact your organization shortly after the protest period closes on July 10, 2020 to begin grant negotiations.
