

Potential Locations for Installation of Ballot Drop-Off Boxes

On September 3, 2021, the state legislature passed AB 37, which added a new requirement that elections officials provide the greater of at least two vote-by-mail ballot drop-off boxes or at least one vote-by-mail ballot drop-off box for every 30,000 registered voters during each early voting period. This means San Francisco will now need to maintain at least 17 ballot drop-off locations for future elections, including the Special Municipal Election scheduled for February 15, 2022.

The Department of Elections has identified 34 potential locations – the minimum number of locations required by current law multiplied by a factor of 2 – to install ballot drop-off boxes within the City.

I. Criteria Used to Determine Potential Locations

A. Primary Criteria

The Secretary of State (SOS) developed regulations [§§20130-20138](#), establishing detailed rules regarding the design, location, number, accessibility, security, hours, collection, and processing of ballots from drop-off boxes.

In regards to locations, CCR §20133 states that, in determining locations of ballot boxes, “the elections official shall, at a minimum, consider concentrations of population, geographic areas, voter convenience, proximity to public transportation, community-based locations, security, and available funding.”

To aid in identifying locations for potential ballot boxes, the Department used a tool made available by the Center for Inclusive Democracy (CID). The CID compiled demographic and voter participation data of the electorate in California and incorporated that data into an online *California Voting Location Siting Tool* that can be viewed at <https://ca.cidsitingtool.org/>. This tool encompasses the criteria established by the California Code of Regulations (other than “security” and “available funding”) as well as the more extensive criteria used by California counties for determining locations for multi-day vote centers under the Voter’s Choice Act (which includes factors such as population density, percentage of eligible voters not registered, percentage of limited English proficiency residents, percentage of the population in poverty, and percentage of youth), and applies a weighting system to model optimal locations. B. Additional Criteria

In addition to the primary criteria described in Part I, the Department established a criterium that each of the city’s supervisorial districts would have no fewer than two drop-off boxes within its jurisdiction, and when determining locations of sites, the Department considered their relative geographic distribution, that is, the proximity of one possible location to another possible location. Such relative analysis helps to ensure that sites are geographically dispersed across the City, notwithstanding other criteria.

The Department further factored whether a particular area contained public facilities, such as libraries, community colleges, parks, etc. or other community-based facilities that could serve as potentially suitable locations, utilizing its extensive repository of polling place data (past and present) and site accessibility surveys.

C. Exclusion Criteria


Although the criteria above provide a guide for the selection of sites, factors that could exclude an otherwise suitable site from selection include the size and accessibility of a site’s exterior, and the availability of the site to host a ballot box. The Department is currently conducting an analysis of the sites tentatively identified as meeting established criteria.
