- View vote-by-mail and provisional ballot processing
- Ask questions of **supervisors** as long as they do not interfere with the conduct of the verification process

Observers May Not:

- Interfere with the process of verifying signatures. The elections official is entitled to determine what constitutes interference.
- Physically handle any verification-related material without the express permission of the elections official.
- Move or rearrange tables, chairs or booths.
- Directly challenge a signature.
- Display any campaign material or wear campaign badges, buttons or apparel.
- Wear the uniform of a peace officer, a private guard or security personnel.
- Use cell phones, two-way radios, computers or other devices while observing the process (Continued)
- Prevent other observers from observing materials or a process.
- Enter secure areas without the express permission of the elections official.
- Delay or interrupt scheduled operations and processes.
