Where will I serve on Election Day?

Depending on when you applied, we will place you at a conveniently located polling place, no more than 10-20 minutes away from your home. The sooner you apply, the closer to home we can place you. You will **receive** your **assignment by mail**. If you have special requests, call (415) 554-4395 after you've received confirmation of your acceptance.

Can I earn extra money if I speak another language? YES!

If you are fluent (*speak, read, and write*) in Spanish, Cantonese, Mandarin, or Filipino; you can earn an extra \$10 for completing an **optional** Online Bilingual Training course. These courses will prepare you to assist voters in other languages on Election Day! Please note you will still be required to attend the standard i n-person Poll Worker Training class.

What should I do if I am no longer able to serve on Election Day?

When will I receive my stipend for serving on Election Day?

Poll Worker stipend checks are mailed approximately three weeks after Election Day. Your stipend will be \$142 and you may receive an additional \$10 for completing a Bilingual Training course.
