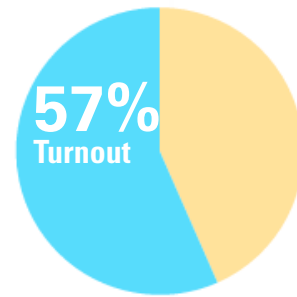

Thank you for serving San Francisco voters throughout the long day on June 7, 2016. Your dedication makes Election Day possible!

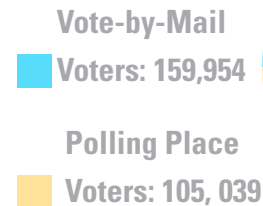
Turnout

A total of 264,993 voters cast their ballot this election. That's a 57% turnout among San Francisco's 468,238 registered voters.



Early Voting

Approximately 6,560 people voted early at City Hall, where voters can visit the Department of Elections' Voting Center to cast a ballot up to 29 days before Election Day. Over 3,400 people brought their vote-by-mail ballots to a ballot drop off station outside City Hall—another convenient way for vote-by-mail voters to drop off their ballot.



Vote-by-Mail

Voting by mail continues to be a popular option among San Francisco's registered voters. In this election, 159,954 voters mailed in or dropped off a vote-by-mail ballot.



Poll Worker Recruitment and Training

You may have noticed that your polling place team had at least one bilingual poll worker. That is because 90% of polling places were staffed with a bilingual poll worker. Of the bilingual poll workers, 694 spoke Chinese, 325 spoke Spanish, 103 spoke Filipino, 36 spoke Vietnamese, 7 spoke Korean, and 19 spoke Japanese.

More than 2,400 poll workers worked this Election; although many were returning poll workers, we would like to recognize the nearly 700 people who signed up to volunteer for the first time. Thank you for your civic engagement!

In addition, the High School Pollworker Program recruited 740 students who were eager to lend a hand and learn about the democratic process.

Many of you participated in supplemental training to brush up on your knowledge for Election Day. Over 275 poll workers attended a practice lab where they got to review voting machine and polling place operations independently at their own pace.

Over 500 poll workers took an online bilingual training class to review their skill in providing language assistance to voters.

Poll Worker Raffle

You likely heard that for this election we would draw ten raffle winners. To be entered into the raffle, precinct teams had to successfully place voted ballots from the Insight machine into correct closing bags and complete the Posted Ballot Statement.
