

To vote, you must register at least 15 days before the election.

Did you know?



If you miss the deadline, you can still register to vote and cast a ballot at the City Hall Voting Center using Conditional Voter Registration.



The address on your registration file determines the contests that will appear on your ballot.



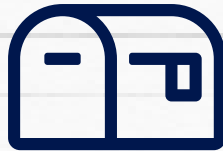
In the March 2020 presidential primary election, your party preference determines which presidential primary contest, if any, will appear on your ballot. To change your party preference, you must re-register.

Submit a request up to one week before Election Day.

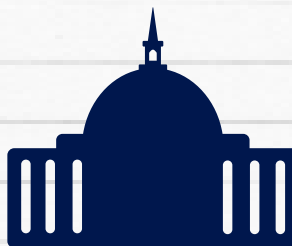


Go to sfelections.org/vbm, call (415) 554-4375, or visit the Department's office.

Sites are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. on Election Day.

At City Hall

Starting 29 days before Election Day, you can register and vote at the City Hall Voting Center.

Accessible voting



Voters with disabilities may use an Accessible Vote-By-Mail System to obtain and mark their ballot in a screen-readable format.

To access the ballot, go to sfelections.org/access.

All polling places have accessible equipment, tools, and services.

Multilingual services
