

No fixed address?

You can still register to vote!

You can register to vote online at **registertovote.ca.gov** or by mail up to 15 days before the next election.

After that date, you can register in person at a voting center or polling place, and vote while you are there.

Need a paper registration form?

Contact the Department of Elections. Paper forms are also available at many government buildings, such as libraries and public assistance agencies.



Keep these 3 facts in mind when registering to vote!

1

You must provide an exact location of where you stay. For voter registration purposes, your **official residence** is wherever you spend most of your time and intend to stay. This can be cross-streets, a park, or a shelter.

You can also provide a **mailing address**, if you choose. For voter registration purpose, your mailing address is where the Department of Elections will send your official election materials – this can be any valid postal address, including a post office box or business address.

Remember to keep your registration current. To check whether you are registered to vote or if your information is current, call the Department of Elections at (415) 554-4375 or go to ***sfelections.org/VoterPortal*** or ***voterstatus.sos.ca.gov***.



If you move to another county or state, you will need to re-register to vote there.
