
# Guide in registering others to vote

1. Register **anyone** who wants to register, **regardless of** political party preference or county of residence
2. You **may not deny** someone the ability to take a registration card with them to complete later
3. You **may not charge a fee** to register
4. You **may not offer an incentive** to register
5. You **may not pre-print any information** on the registration card
6. You **may not alter information** that is written on the card
7. You **may not copy, collect, or share information** from the registration card
8. If you **assist** someone in completing the registration card, and/or are returning it for them, **you must also complete** the "Did someone help you fill out or deliver this form?" boxes
9. Submit all completed applications to the Department of Elections **within 3 business days of completion or by the registration deadline**, whichever is first

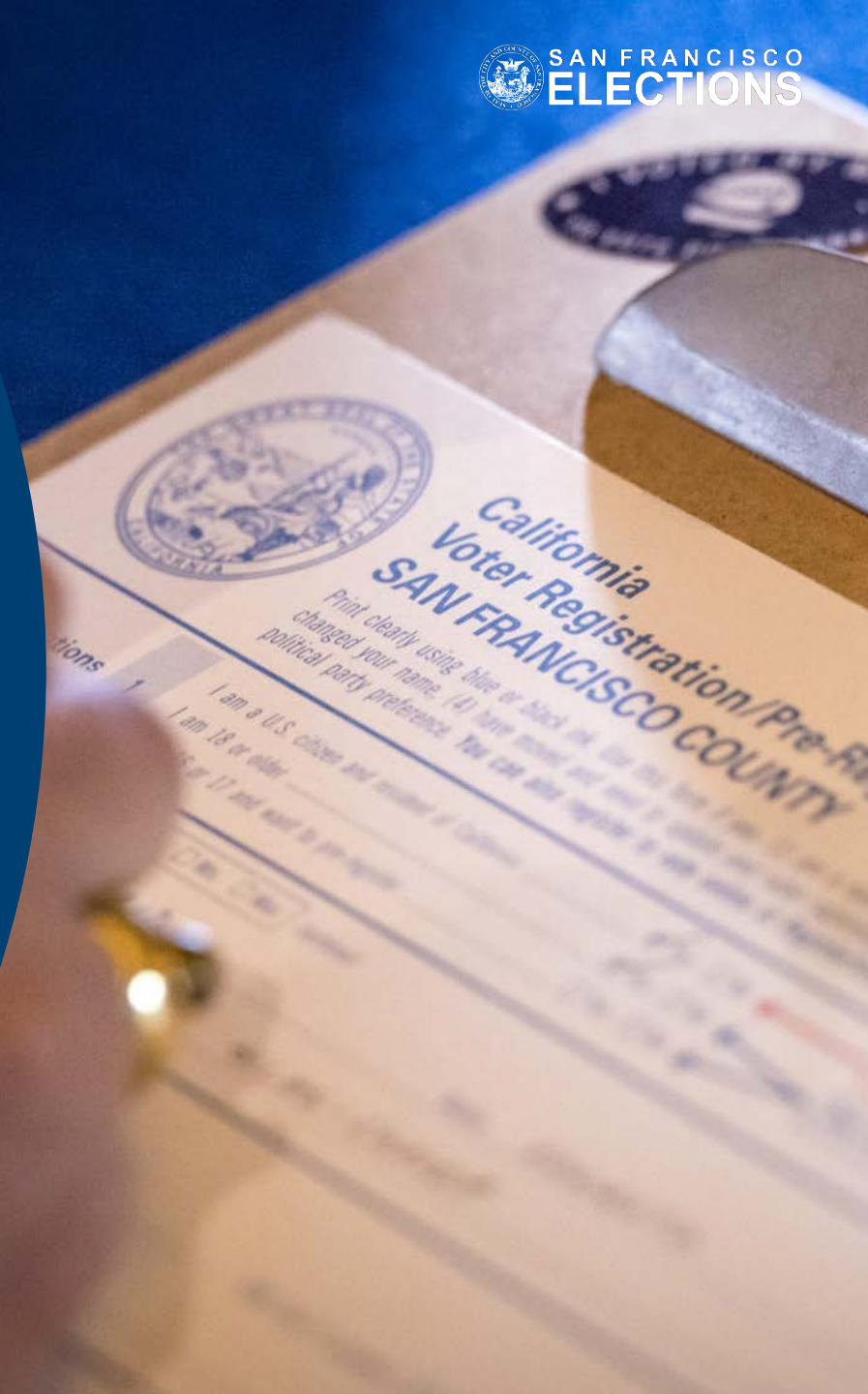

# Registering Voters

1. Give a registration card to **anyone who requests** one
  2. **Assist** registrants with completing the card as needed
  3. Once completed, **review** the card if complete
  4. Detach bottom portion of the card and give it to the registrant as their **receipt**
  5. Keep all completed cards in a **safe and secure** location
  6. Return to the Department **within three business days** of completion, or by the registration deadline, whichever comes first
- \* **Return unused cards to the Department**

# Completing a Registration Card

All voter registration cards should be completed in **blue** or **black** ink

**LEGAL NAME:** Make sure the registrant writes their name in “First, Middle, Last” order.

**ADDRESS:** Make sure registrant enters their home address, not a P.O. Box/work/shelter address. If without a fixed address, write **cross streets**.

**HISTORY:** If the registrant was previously registered to vote, fill out this section. This helps the Department **update voter data**.

# Returning the Registration Card

Registrants can:

1. **Submit** the completed Registration Cards to you (return to the Department in **three business days**),
2. **Deliver** them in-person, or
3. **Mail** the card back to the Department of Elections

**IT'S POSTAGE-PAID!** Just drop it in the mail box, no need to worry about stamps!  
Make sure it gets to the Department of Elections **before the Registration Deadline!**

**REGISTRANT GETS TO KEEP THE RECEIPT!** Detach from the card, and set aside for record-keeping. A **Voter Notification Card** will be sent in the mail in about two weeks.

## SAN FRANCISCO COUNTY

### Important Registration Information

- To vote in the next election, you **must** be at least 18 years old on Election Day and mail or deliver this card at least **15 days** before the next election.
- If you miss the 15-day deadline, you can still register and vote. Contact your county elections official.
- 16- and 17-year-olds that pre-register to vote will automatically be registered voters when they turn 18.
- New voters that register by mail may have to show a form of identification the first time they vote, if they didn't provide a driver license or SSN when registering.
- Once registered, you may vote for any candidate for state or congressional office, regardless of the candidate's or your party preference or lack of party preference.

### Can I vote by mail in the next election?

- Mark "Yes" in box 7 to allow receive your ballot by mail.

- Once registered, to receive your ballot by mail for the next election, send a written request to your county elections official at least 7 days before the election.

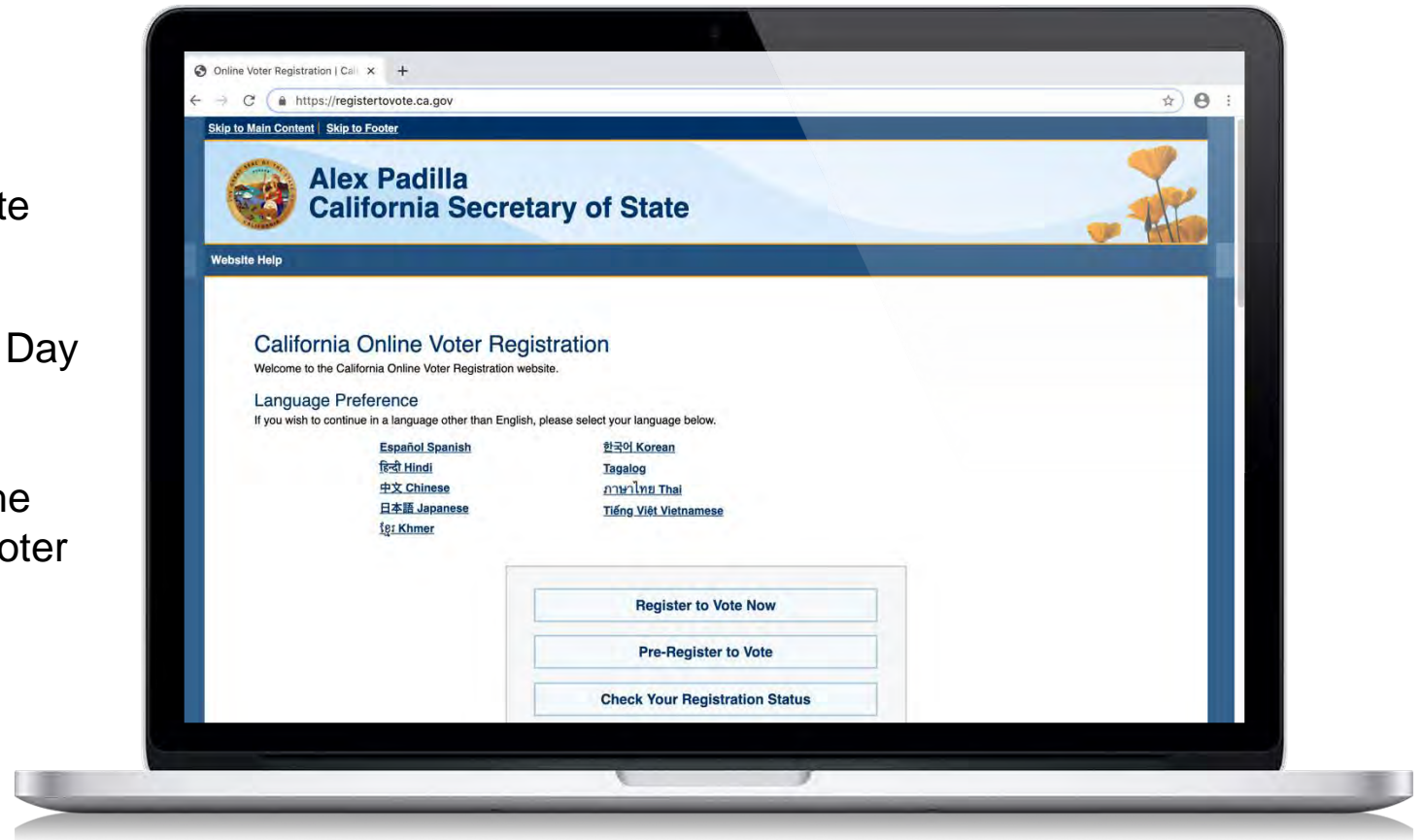

All eligible California residents can register to vote online at ***registertovote.ca.gov***.


16 and 17-year-olds who will turn 18 by Election Day can also pre-register to vote through the site.



Signature Needed

We could not find your signature on the file at the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) or you did not give consent to use your DMV signature. You must sign a printed copy of your voter registration application.

New voters may have to show a form of identification or proof of residency the first time they vote, if a driver license or SSN was not provided when registering.

**Registration Deadline**  
The deadline to register or re-register to vote for any election is 11:59:59 p.m. Pacific Time on the 15th calendar day before that election.

If this deadline has passed:

- You can submit an application and it will be processed for future elections.
- You have the opportunity to "conditionally" register to vote and vote provisionally at your local [county elections office](#). Contact your local county elections official for more information or visit [Conditional Voter Registration](#).

Submit Application

You have two options for submitting your voter registration application:

**Option 1 - Print, sign, and mail your application**

Print and sign your application. Then mail it to your county elections official.

If you are using a public computer, protect your personal information!

Once you are done printing, close the browser and delete the PDF file.

Print Application (PDF)

OR

**Option 2 - No printer available**

If you cannot print your application, you can submit it without your signature. You will be mailed a document that must be signed and returned to your county elections official.

Your voter registration will be delayed until the county receives your signed document.

Submit Application Without Signature

When registering to vote online, the signature from your driver's license or state ID card is used to verify your registration. If you do not have a signature on file with the DMV, you can print, sign, and mail your registration application.

# Best Practices: Organizing Your Voter Registration Drive



## Identify time frame and target number of events/new registrants

Decide the day, location, and time for your voter registration drive(s)



## Identify sites that will reach most unregistered/first time voters

Find a good location for high traffic. Consider indoor/outdoor factors, possible obstacles

Coordinate with people for permission/access to the venue



## Develop your key team members/volunteers

Identify number of volunteers you need and how to recruit them

Decide the day, location, and time for a volunteer training



## Reach out to key and potential partners

Partner with school groups/PTAs, local communities groups, and new citizens

*Coordinate with the **Department of Elections** early. Fill out a Voter Registration Card Statement of Distribution form.*



## Prepare all materials and do pre-event coordination

Gather all of the materials and supplies you will need

Contact volunteers and partners before the event to sort out last-minute details

## Vote by Mail

In early October, all registered voters will receive a ballot in the mail for the November 3, 2020, General Election.

All registered voters can also download a ballot online using the Accessible Vote-by-Mail System.

# Language and Accessibility Resources



## Accessible Voting

Voters with disabilities may use an Accessible Vote-By-Mail System to obtain and mark their ballot in a screen-readable format. To access the ballot, go to ***sfelections.org/access***.

Materials and services are available in Chinese, Spanish, Filipino, Vietnamese, Korean, and many other languages.

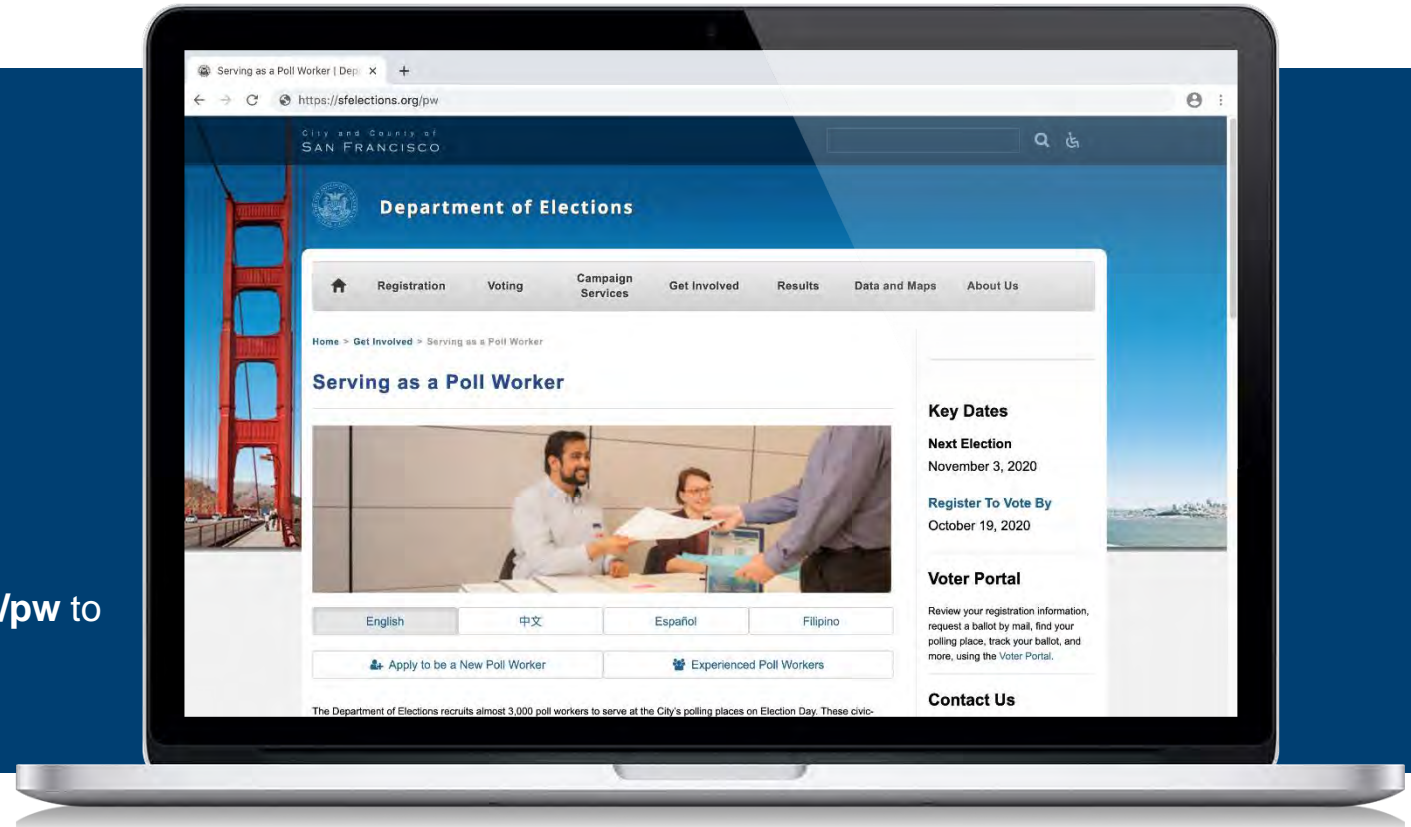
