## ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

to register to vote



Resident of San Francisco



At least 18 years old on  
November 6, 2018



Parent, legal guardian, or caregiver  
(as determined by CA Family Code  
§6550-6552) of a child under 19  
who lives in San Francisco



Not in prison or on parole  
for a felony conviction



Not found mentally incompetent  
to vote by a court

## STEPS TO VOTE

in the San Francisco

### DECIDE

Review the Important Notice and  
Eligibility Requirements

### REGISTER

Fill out a voter registration form  
and return it in person or by mail

**3**

### LEARN

Review the School Board Election  
Booklet to learn about candidates  
on the ballot

### VOTE

By mail, at the City Hall Voting  
Center, or at your polling place

## IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR NON-UNITED STATES CITIZENS

Any information you provide to the Department of Elections, including your name and address, may be obtained by Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) and other agencies, organizations, and individuals. In addition, if you apply for naturalization, you will be asked whether you have ever registered or voted in a federal, state, or local election in the United States. You may wish to consult with an immigration attorney, an organization that protects immigrant rights, or other knowledgeable source before providing any personal information to the Department of Elections and before registering to vote in San Francisco Board of Education Elections.
