Doubling the tax rate while businesses are closing, unemployment rates are skyrocketing and our City heads into an economic recession is just plain irresponsible.</p> <p>The priority of our city officials should be to stabilize the economy, work to retain jobs, and support small businesses through these uncertain times, NOT to raise taxes.</p> <p>In addition, dramatically increasing the transfer tax rate will make it much more expensive to build new affordable and market rate housing, resulting in higher housing prices for future generations of renters.</p> <p>Of the approximately 3,000 housing units in the development pipeline, 1,100 are affordable housing units.
