

# Non-Citizen Voting in the November 8, 2022, San Francisco School Board Election

## Eligibility Requirements

If you are not a U.S. citizen, you must meet all the requirements below to be eligible to register to vote in the November 8, 2022, School Board Election.



Resident of San Francisco



Not currently found mentally incompetent to vote by a court



At least 18 years old on November 8, 2022



Not in state or federal prison for a felony conviction



Parent, legal guardian, or caregiver (as determined by CA Family Code §6550-6552) of a child under 19 who lives in San Francisco

## Steps to Participate

To participate in the November 8, 2022, School Board Election, complete the steps below. For more information, go to [sfelections.org/NCV](https://www.sfelections.org/NCV) or call the Department of Elections.

**1** Review the Important Notice and eligibility requirements listed on this poster.

**3** Read a Voter Information Booklet arriving in the mail in early October to learn more about voting in the School Board Election.

**2** Fill out a Non-Citizen Voter Registration Form and return it to the Department of Elections by mail or in person by October 24, 2022.

**4** Decide how to vote: by mail or in-person at the City Hall Voting Center or a polling place.

## IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR NON-UNITED STATES CITIZENS

Any information you provide to the Department of Elections, including your name and address, may be obtained by Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) and other agencies, organizations, and individuals. In addition, if you apply for naturalization, you will be asked whether you have ever registered or voted in a federal, state, or local election in the United States. You may wish to consult with an immigration attorney, an organization that protects immigrant rights, or other knowledgeable source before providing any personal information to the Department of Elections and before registering to vote in San Francisco Board of Education Elections.
